# **Plot Summary**

Anthony is a grieving man in need of peace following his friend, Ben's, suicide. Feeling largely responsible, he hopes to ease his conscience by teaching Ben's younger brother, Miles how to drive. Upon realizing Miles intended to establish a connection to grow closer to his estranged brother, Anthony struggles to offer any solace. Ignoring his needs and proceeding with the session leads to Miles crashing and tempers flaring. Anthony realizes to make amends with Miles he must open up and preserve Ben's memory. In doing so, Anthony reconciles with Ben and accepts a larger presence in Miles's life.

# Director's Statement


When I was 16 years old, two friends of mine committed suicide in the span of a year. During that period, nothing produced resonated with me or validated what I experienced; more often than not, I found the representation to be one-sided. Typically, there was an emphasis on the how and the why, but the same level of attention was rarely shown to those left behind with little closure. Focusing on the aftermath and the uncertainty that lay ahead was what I related to and felt compelled to explore. For several years, I avoided the subject out of fear I lacked the maturity as a writer or a person to reflect on this artistically. However, my mind was changed after the outline brought about a long-overdue conversation with a great friend who also experienced that frustrating concoction of grief and bitterness alongside me in silence. Though it may have taken six years to speak about it, I'm grateful we finally found the composure and the courage to do so. Initially, I had this notion this project would be the only positive I could muster from that experience; perhaps, I would feel that I had conquered this once and for all. However, I was wrong, as I've been several times before; I'm still weary of looking back but assured I could carry their memory without dragging myself down in the process. 'Bumper to Bumper' isn't and shouldn't be exclusive; grief and struggling to progress are far too universal. I hope anyone watching the film also feels ready to take another step forward.


# Sean Tapiero as Anthony

He's previously worked on a couple movies such as "En Las Sombras" and "I am Become Death" and is eager to see what comes next. He hopes to screen Bumper to Bumper at forthcoming film festivals and gain the attention his short film deserves. He is also looking forward to receiving his BAS in film to advance his profession and work on as many projects as he can. Manny intends to work in the art department of movies in addition to directing and writing them.

### Michael Jimenez – Cowriter and Producer

Michael Jimenez is a Latino-America n filmmaker who graduated from Miami Dade College, earning his bachelor's degree in Film, Television, and Digital Productions. He continues to tell stories with emotional and thematic complexity, hoping to inspire.

### Gabriel Aguilera – Director of Photography

Gabriel is a cinematographer based in Miami, FL originally from Habana, Cuba. He was interested in the process of filmmaking since he was a kid, eventually finding his place in photography. Gabriel obtained his bachelor's degree in Miami Dade College, where he met director Manuel. During his time at the school, he completed several projects as director of photography. He and Manuel worked on different projects before, but Bumper to Bumper is their first collaboration as DoP and director.

# **Director Q&As**

Q: What made you write Bumper to Bumper?

A: The story, the concept was something I always wanted to comment on artistically. The question was always, was I mature enough as a person or as a writer and filmmaker to make this film. Eventually it just came to a time where I felt like I was, and I decided to give it a go.

Q: What did you hope to achieve from making this film?

A: I wanted to share an experience, my story, and show something that I think is overlooked. Especially when it comes to suicide, we typically don't see the aftermath in movies and shows. In this film we wanted to prioritize the aftermath and depict how people without answers struggle with the holes left in their lives.

Q: Why the aftermath?

A: I remember that period of time when I lived through those moments, I felt there was nothing being made that resonated with me and validated my experiences. I didn't just wanted to take this subject and sensationalize it. I wanted to tell a human story and focus on people that need to find their way again without any answers, and find peace.

Q: How do you feel about using your own personal experience in the story?

A: For Mike and me, this is probably the most personal and vulnerable we ever gotten with writing a story. There comes a moment when we kind of acknowledge that we must dig really deep and have discussions we haven't had before. Revisiting that subject was difficult at first. But it eventually took me to reconnect with an old friend of that time, we both lived through these experiences. And it led us to a conversation that it took us 6 years to have. From that point on I felt prepared to write the story.

Q: What do you expect people to take away from "Bumper"?

A: Often when we talk about the subject of suicide, we see it in a headline, in statistics, and it becomes desensitized, and that circles back on how I wanted to tell the story focusing on the aftermath. How we need to pick up the pieces afterwards. The process of grieving is shown in a lot of different ways, and I think at times we become hyper focused in the way we feel, and forget to look around and see how we are impacting others.
